



OPEN DOORS FACT SHEET: FRANCE

INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION Educational Exchange Data from *Open Doors 2013*

In the 2012/13 academic year, **8,297** students from France were studying in the United States (up 0.8% from the previous year). France is the sixteenth leading place of origin for students coming to the United States.

Academic Level: More French students study at the undergraduate level. In 2012/13, their breakdown was as follows:

34.4%	undergraduate
29.1 %	graduate students
26.2 %	other
10.2%	OPT (Optional Practical Training)

Historical trends: The number of French students in the U.S. rose steadily in the 1990s until it peaked at 7,401 students in 2001/02. After a three-year decline, the number of students from France began to rise again in 2005/06. The number of French students in 2008/09 surpassed the 2001/02 high, and then increased again by 4% in 2009/10, 5% in 2010/11 and 1.7% in 2011/12 to a current high of 8,232.
