

AN OVERVIEW OF IIE ADMINISTERED STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIPS & RESOURCES

BENJAMIN A. GILMAN INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Awards of up to \$5,000 to support U.S. citizen undergraduates receiving federal Pell Grant funding at two-year or four-year colleges or universities to study abroad. Students studying a Critical Need Language may receive an award for \$8,000. This program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

DEADLINE: March for Summer & Fall/Academic Year programs; October for Spring programs

FULBRIGHT U.S. STUDENT PROGRAM

Sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Fulbright is the largest U.S. international exchange program offering opportunities for students, scholars and professionals to undertake international graduate study, advanced research, university teaching, and teaching in elementary and secondary schools worldwide.

DEADLINE: October

BOREN SCHOLARSHIPS & FELLOWSHIPS

Funding from the National Security Education Program (NSEP) supports U.S. undergraduate and graduate students to study less commonly taught languages in world regions critical to U.S. interests: Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East. Up to \$20,000 will be awarded to undergraduates and \$30,000 to graduate students depending on cost and length of program.

DEADLINE: January for graduate students; February for undergraduates

GLOBAL E³

The Global Engineering Education Exchange is a study abroad opportunity for undergraduate (and some graduate) engineers to be exchanged between top U.S. and international engineering programs. Students in the program take engineering coursework in an international setting while paying tuition at home. More than 35 U.S. engineering schools and 50 programs in over 20 other countries worldwide are members of this academic exchange consortium (Global E^3 & Global E^4).

DEADLINE: March for Fall Semester/Academic Year; October for Spring Semester

WHITAKER INTERNATIONAL FELLOWS & SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Initially founded by the Whitaker Foundation, the Whitaker Program supports international collaboration in the growing field of biomedical engineering, from graduating seniors to post-doctorate degree holders. The award covers travel, living expenses, and tuition for Fellows (partial or full, depending on host university).
