

Project Atlas®: Trends and Global Data 2012


About Project Atlas:



2001 Worldwide: 2.1 million students




2011 Worldwide: 4.1 million students

C. International Enrollment as a Percentage of Total Higher Education Enrollment for Top Countries 2010/11


